

Certificate III in Visual Art cuv30111

The Certificate III in Visual Arts provides a largely studio-based learning environment introducing the student to drawing, Wacom illustration and sculpture. This practical learning is further supported by an introduction to art history and how the student can use this to support and enhance their own work. Students are encouraged to explore and develop practical skills, and apply creative thinking skills to their own work.

This course includes the following units:

- > Apply knowledge of history and theory to own arts practice (CUVRES301A)
- > Write simple documents (BSBWRT301A)
- > Apply critical thinking techniques (BSBCRT101A)
- > Participate in OHS processes (BSBOHS201A)
- > Develop drawing skills to communicate ideas (CUVACD201A)
- > Source and apply information on the history and theory of design (BSBDES305A)
- > Produce Sculpture (CUVSCU301A)

- > Operate a digital media technology package (ICAICT204A)
- > Explore the use of colour (BSBDES301A)
- > Produce a creative work (CUVPRP301A)
- > Document the work in progress (CUVPRP302A)
- > Work effectively in the creative arts industry (CUAIND301A)
