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## QUORN AREA SCHOOL - UNIFORM POLICY

Our school community supports a dress code. We believe the dress code for the school should be:-

Practical, affordable, comfortable, readily available

Students who attend Quorn Area School are expected to comply with our dress code which is based on a colour code of Navy Blue, Gold and Bottle Green.

- TOPS: QAS Polo Shirts
- BOTTOMS: Tracksuit pants, leggings, tidy denim jeans or shorts maybe worn in the following colours: Black or Navy.
- JUMPERS: QAS Hooded fleecy windcheaters

Each year the Senior Secondary Classes have the option of purchasing a "Seniors" Top as part of their school uniform. This is to be negotiated through the **School Management Process**, but will include Navy Blue, Gold and Bottle Green with the option of a fourth colour. (Black & white are considered colours).

### **Footwear**

- Safety requirements must be adhered to in practical areas.
- School shoes, lace-up or pull on boots, lace-up shoes (eg. track shoes), securely fitted sandals.

**Hats** must be worn in accordance with guidelines set down in our **SunSAFE Policy**. A bucket hat is provided free to all new enrolments.

Quorn Area School provides uniforms that are readily available from the Finance Office with credit card facilities available.

### **Non-compliance with Dress Code**

Our community believes that appropriate behaviour in complying with dress code should be rewarded through:-

- class awards and assembly presentations
- incentives for students (eg. non-uniform days)

Parents should accept responsibility for appropriate wearing of school uniform and support the dress code policy.

Parents will be advised in writing when their child/children do not comply with dress code requirements

### **Exemptions**

The Principal may exempt students from the dress code when receiving a written request from parents. Exemptions may be sort on the following grounds:-

- religious, cultural or ethnic
- students new to school (eg. ask to wear previous uniform to allow time to purchase new uniform)
- mobility
- financial hardship
- genuine medical or family sickness reasons
